MASK UP REGINA!

In a year that has been anything but ordinary, we are blessed and grateful for the outstanding work of our Regina administration, faculty, and staff. When other schools decided to move their students to a virtual only platform in the fall of 2020, Regina adjusted and aligned to meet the educational needs and safety of all students by offering virtual, hybrid and in-person instruction. It quickly became apparent that Regina was leading the way when there was limited guidance and much uncertainty. A measure of success was demonstrated by the fact that Regina classes were in session a full 10 weeks before there was a confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19 within the school setting. Again, a true testament to the diligence of faculty, staff, and students to abide by the precautions established with assistance from the Regina Return to Learn Committee, local public health, and the CDC.

The Board of Education also adjusted to align with school safety and moved to virtual only meetings to minimize exposure of additional people coming into the school setting. Committees remained dedicated to achieving and carrying out previously established goals which also included the recruitment and hiring of a Head of School. The board was successful in achieving this goal and we are excited that Joy Kelly will be officially joining the

Regina community before the start of the next school year. Next steps for the Board of Education include the development of an updated strategic plan to help establish priorities and goals for Regina as we look ahead to the next five years. We look forward to the involvement of all our stakeholders including administration, faculty, staff, parents, students, and alumni as we move forward with that process. Stay tuned!

NEW HEAD OF SCHOOL



Joy M. Kelly was selected for the Head of School position in January after an extensive search. While this position is new, Kelly is quite familiar with Regina, having served as the Regina Jr./Sr. High School principal from 1995-1999. Kelly has been the principal at Bettendorf High School since 2016 following 13 years as associate principal. Prior to her time at Regina, Kelly taught at Linn-Mar High School in Marion and was Director of Evangelization for the Iowa City Catholic Community.

Q What would you say is your favorite career highlight?

A Like most educators, career highlights come from providing meaningful support to students. That can range from simply listening to them as they process their challenges and feelings to visiting them in jail. It's very humbling working with young people, particularly when significant obstacles exist. At Bettendorf High School, we host an annual "Students 1st" banquet to honor those students who persist through challenges to be successful in school. Whether they have experienced a serious illness or have been homeless, these honorees demonstrate grit and through the help of so many educators, they are successful. There is a recognition board for these students right alongside our National Merit and AP Scholar recognition boards. Students take many different paths to success and when they know the adults care about them, believe in them, and will make every effort to support them, they can achieve beyond measure.

Q How does a strong Catholic school option impact or contribute to this community?

A I have had the privilege of serving in both Catholic and public school settings. I have long believed that vibrant communities can support both types of institutions. The Catholic school system is not necessarily for everyone, nor is the public school system the best fit for all. A Catholic school cultivates a community rooted in meaningful relationships, faith-forming experiences and service to others. With an emphasis on social justice principles, Catholic schools prepare young people to be disciples for the Church and the world and both our Church and society will benefit from their goodness and leadership.

Q What do you want people to know about you?

A I think it's important for the Regina community to know that I am really excited and honored to assume the Head of School position. I have been touched by how many former Regina students, parents, and staff members have reached out to me since my selection was announced. As my time at Bettendorf comes to a close, it is bittersweet because I have loved my time here. Bettendorf has been a wonderful place to raise my family and I will always be grateful for the fact that I was able to serve as a high school administrator and see my children every day at work. They are excited that I am returning to Regina and I see Regal apparel in their future!

Ms. Kelly will begin her Head of School duties at Regina July 1, 2021.

Regina is excited to share plans to renovate and expand the Early Childhood Center for the final phase of the **PRIDE in Our Past, Building Our Future** Capital Campaign.

The Early Childhood Center will be re-located in the former 6th grade elementary wing of the campus and features 10,500 square feet of renovations and new construction. This will include a dedicated entry, secure entrance and exit points, five modernized classrooms, new bathrooms, a reception area, offices, wellness space, a teacher work and prep room, and a large indoor play center with access to the outdoor certified Nature Explore Classroom.

"The goal of the Pre-K project is to better serve current enrollment needs and to increase enrollment in the Pre-K program going forward," said Regina Elementary Principal, Celeste Vincent. "This program plays a vital role in introducing families to our Center and the supportive faith-filled Regina community."

Initial allocation for the Early Childhood Center facilities was \$500,000. Thanks to a new, dedicated donation of \$1.2 million, the project has been expanded to enhance the planned renovations and updates.

Since launching the campaign in 2016, Regina has raised more than \$9.1 million, exceeding the \$7.8 million capital campaign goal.

The project is scheduled to be completed by fall 2022.
